- Mike Boeding a graduate of Columbus High School, Mike will be attending Central Community College/ Columbus, majoring in Mechatronics.
- **Keaton Swanson** a graduate of Columbus Scotus High School, Keaton will be attending Southeast Community College/Milford, majoring in Precision Machining and Automation Technology.

The three graduates were selected from applicants representing 25 area high schools. The scholarships were awarded based on results from standardized test scores, letters of recommendation and a personal interview.
