BD, Heart to Heart International and the NAFC Announce 2018 Grantees for a Multi-Year Point of Care Testing Initiative to Improve Patient Outcomes

Alexandria, VA., June 27, 2018 – In an effort to improve evidence-based care in Free and Charitable Clinics using point-of-care testing results, BD (Becton, Dickinson and Company) (NYSE: BDX) in conjunction with Heart to Heart International (HHI) and the National Association of Free and Charitable Clinics (NAFC) today announced six grants to select clinics in the United States.

Point of Care, Enhancing Clinical Effectiveness (PoCECE) is a multi-year initiative that provides grants to clinics that care for underserved and vulnerable populations throughout the U.S. The grants are used to equip the clinics with essential diagnostic point-of-care testing to help evaluate their patients on-site in a timely manner.

PoCECE, funded by BD, a leading global medical technology company, and implemented by HHI in conjunction with the NAFC, provides awards to Free and Charitable Clinics with a desire to use point-of-care testing to diagnose and set treatment protocols with the goal of improving patient outcomes.

"Large numbers of patients seen at Free and Charitable Clinics have chronic diseases that can and should be tracked with laboratory testing," says Judy Hastert, HHI manager of Laboratory Programs. "Through the support provided by our partners at BD and NAFC, HHI's laboratory experts will support these safety-net clinics through the setup process and the first year of operation of the point-of-care laboratory. This program identifies the best of what Free and Charitable Clinics are currently doing to address the burden of chronic disease care and allows them to use point-of-care testing to measure progress of patient outcomes and guide evidence-based treatment."

"In an effort to help ensure medical care is offered to all individuals, especially those who may not otherwise have continual access to health services, we are honored to work with HHI and NAFC to provide grants to these exceptional clinics," said Jennifer Farrington, senior director of Social Investing at BD and vice president of the BD Foundation. "Our hope is that with this award, these clinics can further the significant work they are performing within their communities and continue to make a positive impact."

"Throughout the U.S., more than 2 million medically underserved people receive health care at one of 1,400 Free and Charitable Clinics," says Nicole Lamoureux, NAFC president and CEO. "The NAFC is grateful to work with BD and HHI to support clinics that continue to provide high-quality care while operating with limited resources. This program will allow grantees the ability to enhance their on-site diagnostic capabilities and, in turn, expedite the diagnosis of chronic diseases, monitor treatment protocols and improve health outcomes for their patients."

The Free and Charitable Clinics that will receive the 2018 PoCECE grant are:

Each grant consists of a Clinical Laboratory Improvement Amendment-waived point-of-care test system consisting of instruments, reagents and quality control to perform the following tests: Sodium, Potassium, Chloride, CO2, Glucose, BUN, Creatinine, Ionized Calcium, Hemoglobin, Hematocrit, Cholesterol, LDL, HDL, Triglycerides, Macroscopic Urinalysis, Microalbumin, INR, Hemoglobin A1c, Strep A, HIV, Monotest, Pregnancy, Flu A & B, RSV. The grants also include technical support consisting of standard operating procedures, equipment setup and configuration, competency training and documentation.
